ST MARY'S PARISH 150th ANNIVERSARY Next year, 2020, will mark the 150th anniversary of the establishment of St Mary's Parish Concord. A church and school had existed on the present parish site from the 1840s, however, Concord parish was established in 1870. The launch of the parish celebrations will be held on **Sunday 3 May 2020**. More information will be available later in the year.

CHARITABLE WORKS FUND (CWF) APPEAL The second appeal for the 2019-2020 financial year is being held this weekend. The funds raised by the CWF appeals support agencies of the Archdiocese of Sydney. NOVEMBER MASSES: November is traditionally the month of the Holy Souls. Praying for those who have died is an ancient custom in the Church. It is also a long-established custom that all parish Masses during November are offered for those who have died.

November Mass envelopes are available on the table at the back and in the side porch of the Church for those who wish to have their deceased relatives and friends included in the November Masses.

The envelopes may be placed in the basket that remains at the front of the altar during November. The offerings that are made for November Masses are combined to determine the number of Masses to be offered.

Because there are more Masses than can be celebrated at St Mary's, November Mass offerings are also sent to priests working in the Missions who will offer Masses for the deceased members of our parish community.

In recent years many of the November Mass offerings given by parishioners have been sent to Bishop Miguel of Iquitos, Peru. Fr John Andersen, a Sydney priest, has been working in Iquitos for more than 25 years. Our offerings are distributed to the local priests working in poorer parish communities. In return for our assistance those priests pray for our deceased family and friends in their Masses.

VOTIVE CANDLES A long Christian tradition has linked lighting a candle to prayers of petition. When we pray for a particular intention or for someone who has died, lighting a candle often provides a visible expression of our prayer. That is also why we give a donation so that it becomes “my candle” that I am offering as a sign of my prayer.

For safety reasons many churches have moved to electric votive candles. We have two electric votive candle stands to give parishioners an opportunity to “light” a candle. You simply need to touch the button in front of the candle.

Last year we also added a new votive candle stand in the shrine of *S Maria Vergine Annunziata* at the back of the church. It offers an opportunity to light a specially

designed candle that fits into a glass holder. Please do not lift the glass holders out of the stand, simply place the candle into the cup and use the lighter that is provided. A donation can be placed in the box at the front of the stand.

NATIONAL PRAYER CAMPAIGN FOR DROUGHT The Catholic Bishops of Australia have announced a National Prayer Campaign for Drought to take place during November. People across the country are encouraged to pray for the gift of rain, for people affected by the drought and to provide practical support, where possible. ST MARY'S PARISH 150th ANNIVERSARY Next year we will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the establishment of St Mary's Parish. The launch of the parish celebrations will be held on **Sunday 3 May 2020**.

The present parish site was acquired for a church and school in 1844 and in June 1845 Archbishop Polding blessed the foundation stone for the first church. The first church opened on 7 December 1846 and stood in the present Church Forecourt in front of the present hall. At first priests came from Parramatta to celebrate Sunday Mass. When the parish of St Thomas Becket was established at Petersham (now Lewisham) in 1851, the Burwood-Concord area became part of Petersham parish. By the mid-1860s a priest was residing in a rented house on Parramatta Road Concord. It was located where the present Kindergarten building stands. St Mary's Concord became a separate parish in 1870 and Fr Callaghan McCarthy was appointed the first Parish Priest.
