**as she celebrates the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of her Profession as a Good Shepherd Sister.**

Judith is a resident of St Mary's Villa and joins us each Sunday at the 9.30 am Mass.

After her Profession on 15th December 1949, Judith spent 40 years ministering in Good Shepherd institutions in New Zealand before returning to Australia. In her 70 years of religious life, Judith has been at the forefront of discerning and initiating new areas of ministry for the Good Shepherd Sisters as they adapted to changes in society.

The Congregation of the Good Shepherd Sisters was founded in France by St. Mary Euphrasia Pelletier in 1835. Their Mission has been to care for women and girls who live on the margins of society.

Until the middle of the 20th Century the focus of their ministry was providing care for those in need through their institutions such as the Good Shepherd Home at Ashfield (now Freeman Village).

Today they continue to reach out to those in need by providing support services and education within the community.
