THE SUNDAY READINGS

This year is Year A of the three-year cycle of Sunday readings. Beginning next Sunday, with a few exceptions, we will be reading from St Matthew's Gospel on the Ordinary Sundays. We will continue reading Matthew until Lent begins and then resume Matthew's Gospel after the Easter season.

The Ordinary Sundays follow a semi-continuous reading, that is, one Sunday usually begins where the previous Sunday's Gospel reading concluded.

In the Lectionary (the Book of Readings), the first reading on Ordinary Sundays is taken from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and has been chosen to reflect on or to echo the Gospel reading. The Responsorial Psalm has been chosen to respond to the message of the first reading.

The second reading is not connected with the Gospel and is also a semi-continuous reading. It is an opportunity for us to read from the other books of the New Testament, particularly the Letters of St Paul.

For the next six Sundays, for example, our second reading we will be from the First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians. The letters of St Paul offer many important insights into the early Church but because the homily usually focuses on the Gospel, we often pay little attention to the second reading.

As background to our reading of Paul's letter, it is useful to recall that Corinth was an important trading centre in the ancient world. In the middle of the 1st Century, Corinth was both a strategic and cosmopolitan city. Its population was drawn from every quarter of the Roman Empire.

The issues facing the Christian community in Corinth were in many ways not that different from issues we face in our secular society. Therefore, there are lessons for us to learn as we hear about their struggles.

HOW DO I BECOME A CATHOLIC? The RCIA presumes that there is an extended period of formation and preparation, usually leading to the celebration of Baptism at Easter.
