PRAYER INTENTIONS

We pray for Joan Nutland, Luigi Formoso, Alfia Bonaccorso and all those who have died recently. We remember Fr Bill Delaney, Elsie Guinness, Tony Attard, Nancy Bonaccorso, Clement Walsh and all those whose anniversaries occur about this time and all our deceased parishioners, family members and friends.

We pray for those in many places who have died of the COVID-19 virus, for their families and all who mourn for them.

We pray for all those who are sick and for the health workers who care for the sick.

NSW Government Public Health Public Health (COVID-19) Order

St Mary's Parish is following the restrictions that have been set out by the latest NSW Government Public Health (COVID-19) Order.

From Friday 24 July 2020 all churches are limited to a maximum of 100 people at a Mass. Although St Mary's Concord under the "4 square metre rule" could previously take up to 170, the limit from next Friday is 100 at a Mass or funeral until further notice.

The number of parishioners attending our Sunday Masses over the last two Sundays has been less than 100 at each Mass. However, if the number attending a Mass reaches 100, the doors of the church will be closed for that Mass. Physical distancing still applies

For the moment, the normal Sunday Mass program applies. There are three Sunday Masses: Saturday 6.00 pm, Sunday 9.30 am and 6.00 pm. Weekday Masses (Monday-Friday) at 8.30 am.

The church is open for private prayer on Sunday after the 9.30 am Mass until 12 noon and on Monday to Friday from 9.00 am until 12 noon.

All those entering the church must record their name and contact details (phone or email) on the forms at the church doors. It is important that anyone who is unwell remains at home.

Registration is not required but please note that once our limit is reached the church doors will be closed for that Mass.

The church is fitted with CCTV and images are recorded for the purpose of preventing crime and public safety.

All other parish events and programs remain suspended. To help you to keep in touch with the latest parish news please regularly visit this website.

WHERE TO FROM HERE? Archbishop Fisher has written: "These latest regulations are expected to be in place for some time. The recent spike in cases in Victoria is a reminder that the virus is still with us and we must not be complacent. We must take all reasonable precautions to protect people's health and to observe public health directives. If there are more present in a church than the 4m2 rule allows, or if music ministers, acolytes or communicants fail to observe social distancing, this may well come to the attention of authorities and risk penalties and new restrictions. But if cases remain low in NSW and we demonstrate that we are operating responsibly, we can hope that larger celebrations will again be possible".

REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDING MASS AT ST MARY'S CONCORD

Any parishioners in the high risk categories or any who are unwell are encouraged to stay home. All Catholics are still dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass.

All those entering the church must record their name and contact details (phone number or email address of one adult in each family) on the forms at the church doors. Please use the hand sanitizer available at the doors.

SEATING: Spatial distancing and hygiene continue to apply; people should sit at least 1½m apart. Family groups and couples can sit together. Please note the signs on the pews that indicate positions where you are asked NOT TO SIT.

COMMUNION: stand 1½m from each other when queuing for Communion and Communion will only be given in the hand.

OTHER CHANGERS TO AVOID PHYSICAL CONTACT: Until further notice there is no holy water in the fonts at the doors. There are no cards with the Mass texts, no hymn books, no congregational singing and no procession of gifts. There will be no altar servers and acolytes.

BULLETIN: Printed bulletins are for single use only and must **not** be returned to the boxes. Please take them home or place them in the bin.

COLLECTIONS: The normal practice of passing the collection plates remains suspended. There are two containers at the back of the church and at the side door marked 1st and 2nd Collection. Your regular donations can be placed in the appropriate containers.

For your convenience **Tap and Go stations** are now available at the doors of the church. Tap once to donate \$5; tap twice to donate \$10. Please note that receipts cannot be issued for donations and the transactions cannot be reversed.

CLEANING AFTER EVERY MASS the church should be disinfected in accordance with Health Department guidelines. Five or six volunteers are needed to wipe down all surfaces after every Mass.

Those who cannot attend Mass should keep Sunday holy by setting aside some time for prayer at home, reading the Scriptures of the day, or watching Mass on television or online, asking God for the graces they would normally receive in Holy Communion.

PRIVATE PRAYER IN THE CHURCH: The church will be open for private prayer on Sunday after the 9.30 am Mass until 12 noon and on Monday to Friday from 9.00 am until 12 noon. All those entering the church must record their name and contact details. The church is fitted with CCTV and images are recorded for the purpose of preventing crime and public safety.

SUPPORTING THE PARISH - NEW ENVELOPES New sets of envelopes for 2019-2020 are available to be collected from the tables at the back of the church. They are arranged alphabetically in order of names. Some may find they have a new number.

In the coming financial year (2020-2021) the parish can provide a 50% tax deduction for contributions to the Planned Giving.

For further information and to register to receive a set of Parish Planned Giving envelopes, please contact the Parish Office. **Contributions can also be made electronically on our parish website.**

Tax Receipts for those who have requested them for various appeals are also available on the tables at the back of the Church.

PLENARY COUNCIL DISCERNMENT PAPERS RELEASED Due to the COVID 19 pandemic the National Plenary Council Assembly has been postponed to October 2021 (Adelaide) and April 2022 (Sydney). HERITAGE SIGNS: St Mary's Parish commissioned five heritage signs to mark the sesquicentenary of the parish. They have now been installed in the Church Forecourt and recall historical parish buildings that once existed on the parish site: the first church (1845), the second church (1874), the presbytery (1882), the first school building (1894) and the convent (1898). They have been placed close to the original locations of the buildings.



THE FIRST CHURCH: As well as celebrating the 150th anniversary of the founding of St Mary's Parish, this year also marks the 175th anniversary of the opening of the first church on 7 December 1845. The sign recalling the first church can be found next to the Parramatta Road gates.

The first church was located near Parramatta Road in front of the present parish hall. The photo used for the sign was taken in 1917 when the hall was under construction. Once the hall and classrooms were completed the original church was demolished.

It is possible to view all the signs via the Burton Street entrance to the parish site.

CELEBRATING AT HOME

We can be united with each other in prayer by setting aside a time when we can pause and read the Word of God and share our reflections. Many find it helpful to create a “prayer space” that helps us to focus.

We can also find those places where the Mass is being televised or live streamed.

For those who have access to the Internet there are many places that offer prayers and resources to help us. Those listed below are some examples.

LITURGY BRISBANE offers a range of resources that are updated each week. They can be found on the Liturgy Brisbane website at <https://www.liturgybrisbane.net.au/prepare/sunday-readings-and-family-prayer/>

SUNDAY READINGS READ AT HOME

The Brisbane Liturgy website gives the Sunday readings with associated commentaries and prayers. It is suggested that families gather to read the Scriptures aloud together.

FAMILY PRAYER WEEK BY WEEK

The second resource is designed for families with young children. An extract from the Sunday gospel is provided, along with some reflection questions, a family activity and a worksheet for children.

We invite you to share these resources with anyone who may find them useful.

THE MASS Watch Mass online if you have a computer or a TV that allows you to search the Internet. There are many places now streaming the Mass.

GO TO THE WEBSITE of The Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney www.sydneycatholic.org
On the Home page there is a WATCH HERE button that gives links to parishes that are live-streaming Sunday Mass and in some cases weekday Masses and other devotions.

SACRED SCRIPTURE Set aside a time each day to read the Bible by taking a book, such as one of the Gospels or the Psalms, and working your way through it together. Pause and reflect on the passage. Use *Lectio Divina* when reading a bible text – this is explained in **Universalis** (see below) and also on the Jamberoo Abbey website.

THE ROSARY is a prayer that a family can easily recite together or can be said by those living alone.

APPS and PODCASTS: For those with access to a smart phone or a computer, the following Apps and Podcasts may help families and individuals to set aside time for prayer.

The Examen is a daily reflection that aims to help us to review how God is present in the ordinary moments of life. It is done at the end of the day and is inspired by the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola.

Search iTunes or other platforms for the following podcasts:

The Examen with Fr James Martin SJ This 18 minute Podcast offers a guided reflection from the American Jesuits.

FOODBANK DONATIONS: earlier this year a bin was placed at the back of the church and parishioners regularly donated food items to assist the Jesuit Refugee Service. With the church closed we can no longer donate food but we can still help.
