NSW Government Public Health Public Health (COVID-19) Order

St Mary's Parish is following the restrictions that have been set out by the latest NSW Government Public Health (COVID-19) Order.

All churches are currently limited to a maximum of 100 people at a Mass.

Under the current restrictions and the "4 square metre rule" St Mary's Concord can accommodate 100.

The number of parishioners attending our Sunday Masses over the last two Sundays has been less than 100 at each Mass. However, if those attending a Mass reach 100, the doors of the church will be closed for that Mass. Physical distancing still applies

For the moment, the normal Sunday Mass program applies. There are three Sunday Masses: Saturday 6.00 pm, Sunday 9.30 am and 6.00 pm. Weekday Masses (Monday-Friday) at 8.30 am.

The church is open for private prayer on Sunday after the 9.30 am Mass until 12 noon and on Monday to Friday from 9.00 am until 12 noon.

All those entering the church must record their name and contact details (phone or email) on the forms at the church doors. It is important that anyone who is unwell remains at home.

Registration is not required but please note that once our limit is reached the church doors will be closed for that Mass.

The church is fitted with CCTV and images are recorded for the purpose of preventing crime and public safety.

All other parish events and programs remain suspended. To help you to keep in touch with the latest parish news please regularly visit this website.

CONFIRMATION: Two celebrations of the Sacrament of Confirmation have now been planned for 2020: 7.00 pm on Wednesday 16 September and 7.00 pm on Thursday 17 September. **Please note that 17 September is now fully booked.** Places are still available on Wednesday 16 September.

Under the current restrictions only 100 people can be in the church. Therefore, each Mass will be restricted to 25 candidates who can be accompanied by their sponsor and two family members. **To register for 16 September, please email the Parish Office parish@stmarysconcord.org.au** Further details will then be provided.

1st HOLY COMMUNION will not take place in August. New dates are yet to be determined. Please continue to check the parish website.

SHOULD YOU WEAR A MASK IN CHURCH?

In view of the current spike in cases of COVID-19 including those in and around Catholic institutions and the fact that any of us might be infected and contagious without knowing it, the Archdiocese recommends that extra precautions should be taken to keep ourselves and each other safe.

Health authorities recommend use of a mask in situations where social distancing is difficult, e.g. on public transport and at religious gatherings. The Premier has asked (but not yet required) that churchgoers wear masks at church.

The present position of the Archdiocese is that in addition to all requirements around social distancing and hand hygiene, parishioners are encouraged to wear masks at Mass. However, you need to provide your own mask for hygiene reasons.

Particular care should be taken when greeting and talking to others before and after Mass. When entering the church, please keep social distancing requirements when signing in and please use the hand sanitizer that is provided

REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDING MASS AT ST MARY'S CONCORD

Any parishioners in the high risk categories or any who are unwell are encouraged to stay home. All Catholics are still dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass.

All those entering the church must record their name and contact details (phone number or email address of one adult in each family) on the forms at the church doors. Please use the hand sanitizer available at the doors.

SEATING: Spatial distancing and hygiene continue to apply; people should sit at least 1½m apart. Family groups and couples can sit together. Please note the signs on the pews that indicate positions where you are asked NOT TO SIT.

COMMUNION: stand 1½m from each other when queuing for Communion and Communion will only be given in the hand.

OTHER CHANGERS TO AVOID PHYSICAL CONTACT: Until further notice there is no holy water in the fonts at the doors. There are no cards with the Mass texts, no hymn books, no congregational singing and no procession of gifts. There will be no altar servers and acolytes.

BULLETIN: Printed bulletins are for single use only and must **not** be returned to the boxes. Please take them home or place them in the bin.

COLLECTIONS: The normal practice of passing the collection plates remains suspended. For your convenience **Tap and Go stations** are now available at the doors of the church. Tap once to donate \$5; tap twice to donate \$10. Please note that receipts cannot be issued for donations and the transactions cannot be reversed.

CLEANING AFTER EVERY MASS the church should be disinfected in accordance with Health Department guidelines. Five or six volunteers are needed to wipe down all surfaces after every Mass.

Those who cannot attend Mass should keep Sunday holy by setting aside some time for prayer at home, reading the Scriptures of the day, or watching Mass on television or online, asking God for the graces they would normally receive in Holy Communion.

NEW PARISH HALL SERVERY: During the recent school holidays the former "kitchen" in the parish hall was refurbished to provide a new area for serving drinks and food. Extra storage spaces were also added to the hall. This project was assisted by a Federal Government grant under the Stronger Communities Programme. We appreciate the involvement of our local Federal Member for Reid, Dr Fiona Martin, who supported our application for this grant. Fiona Martin visited the parish and school on Friday 14 August.

VACANT UNITS MONSIGNOR JOHN PEOPLES UNITS, FIVE DOCK: The units provide Self-Care accommodation close to All Hallows Church, particularly for parishioners over 55 years. Both 1 and 2 bedroom units are vacant and are available for immediate occupation. These units have recently been refurbished and contain brand new whitegoods, modern kitchens and bathrooms. ST MARY'S VILLA

This past week marked the tenth anniversary of the actual opening of St Mary's Villa on the parish site at 56 Burton Street. While the formal blessing of the new building took place on 20 June 2010, the first residents moved from the old site on 10 August 2010.

St Mary's Church and Villa

St Mary's Villa had first been opened on 7 July 1985 at 38 Burton Street. Therefore, this year also marks the 35th anniversary of St Mary's Villa as a residential aged care facility operated by St Mary's Parish.

Last year the Villa introduced Service Awards to acknowledge the commitment of the staff. One of the longest serving staff members acknowledged in the awards was **Tahani Osman-Ardasinski** who had been a Registered Nurse at the Villa since it first opened in 1985. Tahani has recently retired and sadly because of the COVID restrictions it has not been possible to celebrate her significant contribution to the care of the residents for the past 35 years. We thank Tahani for her dedicated service and wish her well in her retirement.

In remembering all those who have lived in St Mary's Villa over the past 35 years, we have prayed this week for **Josie Nelson**. Josie was one of the first Concord parishioners to move into the Villa Hostel when it opened in 1985. She was also the Villa's oldest resident. Josie died peacefully last Sunday, 2 August, at the age of 107 year.


HERITAGE SIGNS: St Mary's Parish commissioned five heritage signs to mark the sesquicentenary of the parish.

They have now been installed in the Church Forecourt and recall historical parish buildings that once existed on the parish site: the first church (1845), the second church (1874), the presbytery (1882), the first school building (1894) and the convent (1898). They have been placed close to the original locations of the buildings. It is possible to view all the signs in the Church Forecourt via the Burton Street entrance to the parish site. As well as celebrating the 150th anniversary of the founding of St Mary's Parish, this year also marks the 175th anniversary of the opening of the first church on 7 December 1845.

SUNDAY READINGS READ AT HOME

The Brisbane Liturgy website gives the Sunday readings with associated commentaries and prayers. It is suggested that families gather to read the Scriptures aloud together.

FAMILY PRAYER WEEK BY WEEK

The second resource is designed for families with young children. An extract from the Sunday gospel is provided, along with some reflection questions, a family activity and a worksheet for children.

We invite you to share these resources with anyone who may find them useful.

THE MASS Watch Mass online if you have a computer or a TV that allows you to search the Internet. There are many places now streaming the Mass.

On the Home page there is a WATCH HERE button that gives links to parishes that are live-streaming Sunday Mass and in some cases weekday Masses and other devotions.

SACRED SCRIPTURE Set aside a time each day to read the Bible by taking a book, such as one of the Gospels or the Psalms, and working your way through it together. Pause and reflect on the passage. Use *Lectio Divina* when reading a bible text – this is explained in **Universalis** (see below) and also on the Jamberoo Abbey website.

THE ROSARY is a prayer that a family can easily recite together or can be said by those living alone.

APPS and PODCASTS: For those with access to a smart phone or a computer, the following Apps and Podcasts may help families and individuals to set aside time for prayer.

The Examen is a daily reflection that aims to help us to review how God is present in the ordinary moments of life. It is done at the end of the day and is inspired by the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola.

The Examen with Fr James Martin SJ This 18 minute Podcast offers a guided reflection from the American Jesuits.

FOODBANK DONATIONS: earlier this year a bin was placed at the back of the church and parishioners regularly donated food items to assist the Jesuit Refugee Service. With the church closed we can no longer donate food but we can still help.
