CHURCH ATTENDANCE

The church is now open and normal parish Masses have resumed. Restrictions still apply:

•Attendees must check-in using the Service NSW App or by clearly recording their name and contact details on the form provided by the Parish.

•Social Distancing - 1 person per 4 square metres. Please only use every second pew. The capacity of the church is 150.

•Everyone must wear a mask, except when reading, presiding or singing.

•Hand Sanitiser is available at church entrances.

•Congregational singing is not permitted. A socially distanced choir of up to 10 fully vaccinated people is allowed.

The revised numbers for Funerals, Memorial Services and Weddings only apply if everyone attending is fully vaccinated. If even one person present is unvaccinated, the former restrictions apply.

It is anticipated that the 4 sqm rule that limits the number who can attend a Mass will change to 2 sqm from 8 November.

CAN THE UNVACCINATED COME TO MASS?

Yes, because we are following the current NSW Health Guidelines. Those guidelines no longer list "Places of Worship" as higher risk sites and therefore churches are now open to all people to parish Masses regardless of their vaccination status. All those attending must wear masks and observe other social distancing requirements. The revised guidelines still require full vaccination for weddings and funerals.

Please note that if even one unvaccinated person attends a Funeral, Memorial Service or Wedding, then numbers are still limited to 10 people.

NOVEMBER MASSES: November is traditionally the month of the Holy Souls. Praying for those who have died is an ancient custom in the Church. It is also a long-established custom that all parish Masses during November are offered for those who have died. **November Mass envelopes** are available on the table at the back and in the side porch of the Church for those who wish to have their deceased relatives and friends included in the November Masses.

The envelopes may be placed in the basket that remains at the front of the altar during November. The offerings that are made for November Masses are combined to determine the number of Masses to be offered.

Because more Masses are requested than can be celebrated at St Mary's, November Mass offerings are also sent to priests working in the Missions who will offer Masses for the deceased members of our parish community.

In recent years many of the November Mass offerings given by parishioners have been sent to the Bishop of Iquitos, Peru. Fr John Andersen is a Sydney priest who has been working in Iquitos for the past 30 years. Our offerings are distributed by the Bishop to the local priests working in poorer parish communities. In return for our assistance those priests pray for our deceased family and friends in their Masses.

VOTIVE CANDLES A long Christian tradition has linked lighting a candle to prayers of petition. When we pray for a particular intention or for someone who has died, lighting a candle often provides a visible expression of our prayer. That is also why we give a donation so that it becomes "my candle" that I am offering as a sign of my prayer.

For safety reasons many churches have moved to electric votive candles. We have two electric votive candle stands to give parishioners an opportunity to "light" a candle. You simply need to touch the button in front of the candle.

We also have a votive candle stand in the shrine of *Santa Maria Vergine Annunziata* at the back of the church. It offers an opportunity to light a specially designed candle that fits into a glass holder. A donation can be placed in the box at the front of the stand.

TAX RECEIPT FOR PLANNED GIVING

Printed tax receipts are available from the table at the back of the church. The tax deduction for the *Parish Planned Giving* is only provided for those contributors who have already nominated that they require a *tax receipt*.

For your convenience **Tap and Go stations** are now available at the doors of the church. Tap once to donate the amount shown. **Please note that receipts cannot be issued for donations and the transactions cannot be reversed.**



St Mary's Church Concord

The painting of the Blessed Virgin Mary that is the dominant image of Mary in the church is a copy of *The Immaculate Virgin of Los Venerables* painted by the Spanish artist Bartolome Esteban Murillo (1618-1682) in about 1678.

It is believed that the original painting was commissioned from Bartolomé Esteban Murillo by Justino de Neve, who was ecclesiastical president of the *Hospital de los Venerables* in Seville. He later donated it to the chapel at the hospital. The original painting is now in the Prado Museum in Madrid

The title of Immaculate Virgin reflects the belief that Mary was without sin from the first moment of her being. Although it was only officially declared a dogma of the Church in 1854, belief in the Immaculate Conception of Mary had been a popular devotion in Spain since the 16th century.

In this painting Murillo combined two different iconographic traditions: the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption. Although the Assumption of Mary was only declared to be a dogma in 1950, it too had been a popular devotion for many centuries.

The parish's copy was cleaned and restored in February 2020 to mark the Sesqicentenary of the founding of St Mary's Parish (1870-2020).

HERITAGE SIGNS: In 2020 St Mary's Parish commissioned five heritage signs to mark the sesquicentenary of the parish. They can be seen in the Church Forecourt and recall historical parish buildings that once existed on the parish site: the first church (1845), the second church (1874), the presbytery (1882), the first school building (1894) and the convent (1898). They have been placed close to the original locations of the buildings.

The first church built of the St Mary's Parish site was blessed and opened by Archbishop Polding on 7 December 1845. The painting that now hangs in the parish hall is based on a photograph taken in 1917 when the hall was under construction.

Prior to European settlement, the Burwood-Concord district was occupied by the Wangal clan. They called themselves the Eora, meaning 'the people' and they had been living in the Sydney area for at least 10,000 years.

The British colony of New South Wales had been established in January 1788 with the arrival of the First Fleet under the command of Captain Arthur Phillip. In late 1788 a small settlement was established at Parramatta and by 1791 a bush track had been built between Sydney and Parramatta that became what is now Parramatta Road.



In 1793 some free settlers received grants in the area then named Liberty Plains. In that same year, land grants were made to six non-commissioned officers in the district that came to be known as Concord.

The Concord-Burwood district continued to grow and in 1844 land was purchased by the Catholic Church on Parramatta Road at Concord for the site of a church and school.

At that time there was no resident priest. A priest came from Parramatta, where the parish of St Patrick's had been established in 1827. When the parish of Petersham (now Lewisham) was established in 1851, the church at Concord became part of Petersham parish. St Mary's Concord became a parish in 1870.



The first church was also used as a hall and a school. A Catholic School, operating with Government funds, had begun operating on the parish site in 1846.
